

## A Midsummer Night's Dream: Background and Characters

Benjamin Britten wanted a new opera to open the refurbished Jubilee Hall in Aldeburgh. There wasn't enough time to create a new libretto so he and librettist Peter Pears decided to adapt Shakespeare's *A Midsummer Night's Dream*, a play they greatly admired. The opera was composed in 10 months and premiered June 11, 1960, at the Aldeburgh Festival. The performance was conducted by Britten.

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## \* Countertenors

The highest male voice, this falsetto voice type emerged in European music of the 14th and early 15th-centuries, and regained popularity in the second half of the 20th century, due in large part to the career of Alfred Deller, an English countertenor who created the role of Oberon in Britten's *A Midsummer Night's Dream.* 

## What is a co-production?

A co-production is when two or more companies collaborate on creative ideas, and share financial and human resources to make one artistic piece. *Opera lingo:* In the opera world, people refer to this type of partnership as a "co-pro".

Lysander	A young man of Athens, in love with Hermia	Tenor	lye-SAN-der
Demetrius	A young man of Athens, who pursues Hermia after abandoning Helena	Baritone	deh-MEE-tree-yus
Hermia	A young woman of Athens, in love with Lysander and childhood friends with Helena	Mezzo-soprano	HER-mee-yah
Helena	A young woman of Athens, still in love with Demetrius to whom she was once engaged.	Soprano	HEH-leh-nah
Bottom	A weaver chosen to play the role of Pyramus in the Rustics' play for Theseus's marriage celebrations.	Bass	
Quince	The leader of the Rustics who is trying to organize the play.	Bass-baritone	
Flute	A bellows-mender chosen to play the role of Thisbe in the Rustics' play. A bellows-mender is the person who fixes bellows, devices that increase flames by blowing air on coals; (see right)	Tenor	
Snug	The tinker chosen to play Pyramus's father in the Rustics' play. A tinker is a person who works with tin.	Bass	There
Snout	The joiner chosen to play the lion in the Rustics' play. A joiner is a woodworker who makes objects by joining two pieces of wood without the use of nails.	Tenor	
Starveling	The tailor chosen to play Thisbe's mother in the Rustics' play. A tailor sews and mends clothes.	Baritone	
Cobweb Peaseblossom Mustardseed Moth	Fairies in Tytania's court. Ordered to care for Bottom when the Queen falls in love with him.	Trebles (children)
