EAST MEETS WEST Cultural Extravaganza to Kick Start Asian Heritage Month Celebration at Chinese Cultural Centre

Toronto, April 17, 2012 – In celebration of Asian Heritage Month, the Chinese Cultural Centre of Greater Toronto (CCC) has partnered with the Art Gallery of Ontario (AGO), the Canadian Opera Company (COC) and the Sony Centre For The Performing Arts to present **EAST MEETS WEST** – A Cultural Extravaganza on Thursday, May 3, 2012 at 6:30 p.m. Taking place at the Chinese Cultural Centre (5183 Sheppard Ave. E., Toronto), this admission-free event previews three upcoming exciting cultural events in Toronto this year, namely *Zhang Huan: Ash Paintings and Memory Doors* at the AGO (May 5 – Aug. 19), *Semele* at the COC (May 9 – 26) and the *National Chinese Acrobats with the Kitchener-Waterloo Symphony* at the Sony Centre For the Performing Arts (May 12), and features live classical music, opera, dance and acrobatic performances as well as a hands-on community art-making activity.

The May 3 gala will start with traditional Chinese dragon and lion dances. The 50-member **Ontario Cross Cultural Music Society Youth Orchestra** will showcase instrumentals and medley as part of the 15th anniversary celebration of Hong Kong's return to China. Renowned soprano **Angela Zheng** will collaborate with the Orchestra. Acclaimed virtuoso player **Wendy Zhao** will display her dexterity and percussive skills on Pipa. The finale will be a Chinese dance performance.

Robert Wainstein, Research Analyst for the AGO's curatorial department, will present an interesting overview of the Gallery's upcoming Zhang Huan exhibition, discussing the artist's works and their significance. Members of the AGO's education and public programming department **Vincent Luk** and **Catherine Campbell** will lead a creative hands-on project inspired by *Zhang Huan: Ash Paintings and Memory Doors*.

The COC offers a tantalizing preview of Handel's opera about the pitfalls of love affairs between gods and mortals, with a special performance by soprano **Mireille Asselin** and pianist **Timothy Cheung**. Both artists are members of the COC's Ensemble Studio, a training program for young opera professionals. On May 3 Asselin will perform a selection of operatic arias, including a musical excerpt evocative of *Semele*'s sensual tone and vividly dramatic sound.

In addition to a jaw-dropping performance by four contortionists from the world-renowned Hunan Acrobatic Troupe in China, the Assistant Conductor of the Kitchener-Waterloo Symphony, **Evan Mitchell**, will speak about the musical aspect of the show.

More information on *Zhang Huan: Ash Paintings and Memory Doors* at the AGO, *Semele* at the COC and the *National Chinese Acrobats with the Kitchener-Waterloo Symphony* at the Sony Centre will be available at the Chinese Cultural Centre on May 3, with each participating arts organization hosting an information booth about their respective exhibits and performances.

Zhang Huan: Ash Paintings and Memory Doors at the Art Gallery of Ontario (May 5 to Aug. 19, 2012)

Incense and memory will pervade the Art Gallery of Ontario (AGO) this summer with the opening of *Zhang Huan: Ash Paintings and Memory Doors*. On display in the Philip B. Lind Gallery, the exhibition features 12 works from two of Zhang's most recent series: *Ash Paintings*, detailed canvases painted with authentic incense ash collected from Buddhist temples; and *Memory Doors*, carved antique wood doors imprinted with photographic imagery. Both series are inspired by images from old magazines, newspaper clippings, and family photographs that depict scenes of daily life, labour, and military service during the 1940s and 1970s. The works address the disconnection between personal and collective memory – what people remember – and the official historical record of that era in Chinese history.

The exhibition is included in the price of general admission to the AGO, ranging from \$11 to \$19.50. Admission is free for children under the age of 5 and AGO members.

Semele at the Canadian Opera Company

(May 9, 11, 13, 16, 19, 22, 24 and 26, 2012)

The Canadian Opera Company presents the company premiere of George Frideric Handel's *Semele* in a production directed by famed Chinese visual and performance artist Zhang Huan. Zhang's *Semele* takes the world of classical music and presents it through his perspective

as a contemporary Chinese artist, drawing on parallels between Greco-Roman mythology and Chinese legends, as well as Buddhist concepts of karma and reincarnation, to create a true interaction of Eastern and Western cultures. The production's centerpiece is a 450-year-old Ming Dynasty ancestral temple salvaged by Zhang from a small town in China.

Sung in English with English SURTITLESTM, *Semele* runs for eight performances at the Four Seasons Centre for the Performing Arts (145 Queen St. W). Single tickets for *Semele* are \$12 – \$318 (includes applicable taxes).
